# YOUR QURBANI IN ASIA

The joys of Eid were brought to hundreds of thousands of families across Asia this year. The largest Qurbani programme in the region took place in India's West Bengal region, where 4,120 cows were sacrificed. The meat here was distributed across hundreds of poor Muslim villages.

The next most extensive programme was for Afghan refugees in Pakistan who benefitted from 3,246 of your animals. Thousands of refugees living in camps in the country's northwest border regions were given Udhiyyah to enjoy, alhamdulillah.

Further inland in Pakistan, over 600 cows and goats were sacrificed to feed thousands of families in KPK, Punjab and Sindh. The Udhiyyah of hundreds of more animals was also delivered to thousands of families in the mountainous Kashmiri district of Bagh, alhamdulillah.

Finally, thousands of miles east in Bangladesh, hundreds of animals were sacrificed. The meat was distributed to poor families in Jashore, Kishoregonj and Thakurgaon.



## YOUR QURBANI IN THE MIDDLE EAST



Ummah Welfare Trust's largest programme in the Middle East came in Yemen in response to the war and hunger. Alhamdulillah, over 4,500 goats were sacrificed here, feeding tens of thousands of families across the capital Sana'a and in the besieged province of Ta'iz.

Further north in Bilaad ash-Shaam, over 500 rams were sacrificed in Syria's Idlib province while 367 were sacrificed in besieged Gaza. The meat of these animals brought smiles to thousands of surviving families still recovering from the devastating effects of war.

And in Iraq, the Udhiyyah of nearly 40 animals was provided to 750 families in Mosul and Ramadi, alhamdulillah.

## YOUR QURBANI IN AFRICA & EUROPE



Over 3,200 animals were sacrificed across the African continent this year. Qurbani programmes took place in Gambia, Malawi, Mauritania, Mozambique, Sierra Leone and Ethiopia, alhamdulillah.

The largest programme was in Malawi, where 1,815 goats and 125 cows were sacrificed, feeding thousands of families in the central districts. In nearby Mozambique, 300 goats were sacrificed, providing meat to families in the shanty areas of the capital, Beira.

Alhamdulillah, to the north, 375 animals were sacrificed in Ethiopia and given out to orphaned families in Shashamane and to displaced families in Bishan Guracha.

Across the continent in West Africa, over 500 animals were sacrificed to feed poor Muslims in The Gambia's. A further 138 animals were sacrificed in Sierra Leone's northern district. And in Mauritania's deserts, over 150 families were able to enjoy the meat from the sacrifices of 38 goats.

Lastly, over 190 sheep were sacrificed in Albania, feeding hundreds of poor and orphaned families for the days of Eid, alhamdulillah.
