THE DELUSIONS OF WEALTH

Shaytan has deceived many of us today into a self-centred lifestyle. We think happiness lies in consumption, gratification and being aloof from those around us.

Like Fira'wn's advisor, Qaroon, before us, we are intoxicated by comforts and materialism. And like him, we have become conceited with it, saying, 'I was given it due to my knowledge.' (28:78)

We believe this wealth is ours, and so we do everything we can to protect it, cherish it and expand it. On occasion, we sprinkle a little in charity's way, like a man clearing dirt from under his fingernails.

However, the ways of our beloved Messenger of Allah SallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam and his Companions were different. He once said:

‘The son of Adam boasts: My wealth! My wealth! O son of Adam, have you truly earned any wealth but what you ate and consumed, or put on and wore out, or spent in charity so it remained (with Allah in reward)?’

The Companions RadhyAllahu 'anhum knew that happiness lay in faith followed by action, in suppressing desires, in sacrificing for Allah, and in preferring others over themselves. Happiness was in choosing the everlasting over that which perishes and vanishes.

When night would fall, the Messenger of Allah's wealthier companions would take the people of As-Suffah to their homes and feed them. Some companions would take one, others two or three, and some up to nine and ten. The eminent Ansari, Sa'ad ibn 'Ubadah RadhyAllahu' anh would take up to eighty people home every day and feed them.

Unlike us, the Sahabah were not enamoured by their wealth. They knew its purpose, its reward and, more pertinently, its tribulations.

May Allah allow us to follow the likes of Sa'ad, and continue nourishing the Ummah with that which Allah has given us.

REHABILITATING SYRIA'S FUTURE

The fallout from Syria's war remains arguably the biggest of any conflict since World War II. In the eleven years since protests began, over a million Muslims have been killed, half a million have been forcibly disappeared, and twelve million have been driven from their homes.

The work needed to rehabilitate survivors here remains huge. In the past year, Ummah Welfare Trust has spent over £8 million in its efforts to do so. Alhamdulillah, the charity has delivered free bread, distributed milk powder, provided medical equipment and subsidised free schools.

On top of this, thousands of widows, orphans, teachers and injured civilians have received regular financial support. The assistance has made it easier for these steadfast Muslims to survive the crippling poverty that a decade of war has created.

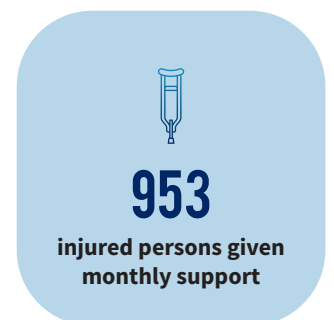

GAZA: BESIEGED BUT NOT BROKEN

Towards the end of last year, occupiers completed its construction of a wall surrounding the Gaza strip. Today that wall fully-blockades over two million Palestinian Muslims within what is the largest open-air prison on earth.

This was after another bombing campaign during the summer in which over 250 civilians were mercilessly killed. At least a hundred of the victims were women and children; killed after they'd already endured years of siege and oppression. May Allah have mercy on them.

The despair amongst India's Muslims, who enjoy more than a thousand years of noble history here, is palpable. As the persecution has increased, so has the poverty and ghettoization. Muslims today have the lowest health, income and education outcomes amongst all of India's minorities.

Muslim-majority areas such as Jammu Kashmir, West Bengal and Assam have borne the brunt of the tyrannical fanaticism. Thanks to you, it is these regions that have remained the focus of Ummah Welfare Trust's relief work.

GIVING FAITH & INDEPENDENCE

Over £6 million has been spent to strengthen the identity and independence of India's Muslims in the past year. Thousands of our marginalised brothers and sisters have been helped through a multitude of programmes, alhamdulillah.

Free health care, financial grants and new homes have also been provided to desperate and abandoned families. As the world closes in around them, we ask Allah to aid, empower and protect them from every side.



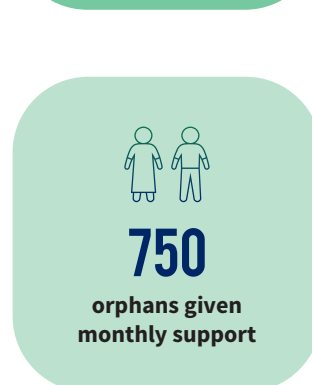

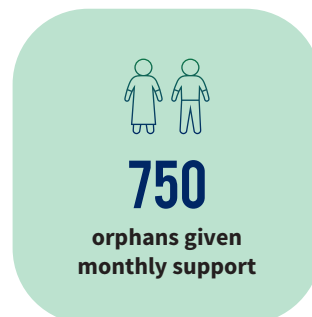

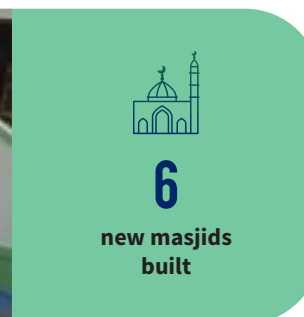

Unending price rises continue to crush Pakistan's poor. The country's record inflation during the past year has seen the price of staples, such as sugar, surge higher than petrol. More than a third of Pakistanis cannot purchase food today because of it.

Though prices have increased, so has Ummah Welfare Trust's support. The charity has improved the lives of thousands in the past year by digging wells, building homes, constructing masjids, and providing free education and healthcare.

Widows, orphans, teachers and vulnerable families have also received much-needed zakat to survive the inflation scourge. The assistance has made it easier for these Muslims to buy necessities, pay bills and raise their children, alhamdulillah.

THE AFTERMATH OF AFGHANISTAN'S LONG WAR

The longest war in modern history finally ended last year, alhamdulillah. Twenty years of conflict in Afghanistan had killed hundreds of thousands of civilians and destroyed the living conditions for countless more. This all finally ended thanks to Allah's grace.

Despite the war's end, however, the general poverty sadly worsened due to the collapse of the rentier economy and the cynical freezing of the country's financial assets. Thousands of workers were left without salaries, and, worse still, millions of children were left facing starvation.

Ummah Welfare Trust launched a £10 million appeal earlier this year in response to the dire situation. Alhamdulillah, you responded to the charity's call, enabling it to deliver food and winter supplies to tens of thousands of desperate families in Paktia, Khost, Kandahar and Helmand.

Food vouchers were also delivered to families in Kabul and Ghazni, while thousands of refugees in neighbouring Pakistan were helped with food packs. The region's many widows, orphans and teachers were amongst those who benefitted most.

THE UYGHUR GENOCIDE WHERE IS THE UMMAH?

‘Absolutely no mercy!’ was the remark of China’s government in 2014 as it began its genocidal purge of East Turkestan. Since then, millions of Uyghur Muslims have been rounded up in camps where our brothers are tortured, sisters are defiled and Allah’s religion is mocked.

More painful still, an estimated 900,000 of their children have been kidnapped to be raised as rootless atheists. When they’re not being indoctrinated, they’re forced to work as slaves in factories and fields, all the while being regularly beaten and starved.

Six-month-old babies have been snatched from the arms of their mothers, who’ve been dragged away to torture cells. Meanwhile, the Ummah’s leaders remain unmoved, choosing instead to trade in the wealth of the oppressors rather than honour the brotherhood of those they oppress.

We ask Allah to forgive us, for to see and not to act is the greatest betrayal. And we ask Him to raise amongst us Muslims who will right the terrible wrong that is being inflicted upon our Uyghur brothers and sisters in East Turkestan today.

TURNING THE TIDE

Over 50,000 Uyghur Muslims have managed to flee this terrible genocide to Turkey, where Ummah Welfare Trust has been helping them rebuild their lives. Since 2018, the charity has spent nearly £2 million giving them support and hope where there once was none.

Your donations have been used to pay this fledgling community’s school fees, medical bills, debts and household costs. Alhamdulillah, Ummah Welfare Trust has also begun offering free Islamic schooling for their children so that the future remains bright for this tragically forgotten nation.

ALLEVIATING WEST AFRICA'S POVERTY

Some of Ummah Welfare Trust's most significant work continues to be in West Africa, alhamdulillah. The charity has spent over £6 million on da'wah and zakat programmes in the past year to help the region's proud and industrious Muslims overcome their poverty.

In The Gambia, a sliver of land just 300 miles long, your zakat has been distributed to over 20,000 imams, teachers, ulama, widows and labourers. Hundreds of poor families impacted by last summer's terrible storms have also been helped to restart their lives.

And to strengthen the country's faith and those who convey it, Ummah Welfare Trust has provided rickshaws to low-paid imams, delivered training programmes to the country's du'at, and helped madrasahs with subsidies, renovations and literature, alhamdulillah.

The Gambia was once part of a larger Islamic polity that formed the greater Senegambia region. The love and learning of Islam here, despite today's poverty, reflects the religion's noble standing. It is this standing that Ummah Welfare Trust strives to elevate inshaAllah.

Four hundred miles south in Sierra Leone, teacher's training and financial assistance have been delivered to over 6,000 imams, alhamdulillah. Hundreds of unpaid teachers here have also been given salaries to ensure that thousands of children can learn the Qur'an for free.

In nearly three hundred villages across the country, new wells have also been installed. And to help realise Islam's huge potential in the country, Ummah Welfare Trust will complete the construction of eighty new masjids here this year, inshaAllah.

STRENGTHENING MADRASAHs...

The issue of education remains a major challenge. Sadly, modern secular liberal education and the environment it fosters has created a wave of agnosticism and moral laxity in the Ummah. Today, countless young Muslims live unmoored from their values and faith.

The madrasah remains a bulwark against this. Run properly, it equips young children with the correct beliefs, ethics and goals to live their lives in accordance with Allah's will. Strengthening their role, therefore, is a huge part of Ummah Welfare Trust's work.

During the past year, the charity has paid madrasahs' salaries, covered utility bills, and renovated classrooms. The support has ensured that over 100,000 children, across seventeen countries, are learning the Qur'an and its perfect guidance for free, alhamdulillah.

And just as notable, Ummah Welfare Trust has revised Islamic curriculums in several countries, ensuring that thousands of children are better-prepared against today's torrents of misguidance.

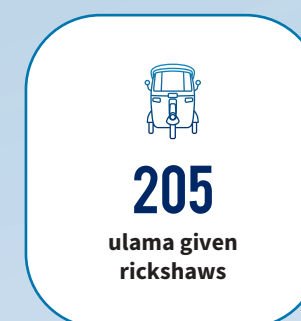
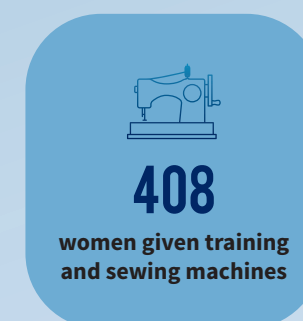
HEALTH

Over half of the Ummah today has no access to proper health care. They're either too poor or too remote, and often they're both. As a result, countless Muslims suffer and die needlessly everyday because they cannot access routine treatments.

To redress this, Ummah Welfare Trust runs free clinics, funds free surgeries and delivers equipment to remote hospitals. Alhamdulillah, thousands of poor patients have lived fuller and more productive lives in the past year thanks to the support.

After iman, good health is the Ummah's best prescription. It allows children to learn unhindered, parents to secure an income, and communities to worship Allah and establish His religion.

Better health means also better incomes, stronger communities and a more vibrant religion. With your help, Ummah Welfare Trust's efforts to restore this blessing for millions continues.



LIVELIHOODS

To seek and earn a halal income has been commanded in the shari'ah of Allah. A halal income protects a believer's values and faith, and improves his prospects for a better life. It also garners honour, self-respect and continuous reward.

Thanks to you, Ummah Welfare Trust has spent over half a million pounds helping poor Muslims achieve this. The charity has provided livestock to farmers, rickshaws to ulama, shop stalls to villagers and training to widows, alhamdulillah.

As well as creating a path to ease, being self-employed has encouraged our brothers and sisters to rely more upon Allah the Provider.

...AND HER ORPHANED CHILDREN

Widowhood continues to be one of the Ummah’s biggest challenges. Sadly, millions of our sisters live as impoverished widows and single mothers. The only way many of them survive is by begging, or doing hard labour - which is often exploitative and becomes difficult with age.

Because of wars and oppression, many widows are in fact under forty years of age. Remarriage, however, is often difficult, and with children still in tow, many need support over a prolonged period if they are to live secure lives.

Thanks to you, Ummah Welfare Trust has assisted over 13,000 of these vulnerable Muslims in the past year. Single and regular grants have helped our sisters with their household needs, and given them hope at a time in their lives when they needed it most.



And then there’s the children. Like their mothers, orphans across the Ummah are overwhelmingly unsupported. In the Qur’an, Allah Most High likens the one who repulses these innocents to one who denies the Day of Judgement. To help orphans, therefore, is a clear sign of faith.

Motivated by this conviction, Ummah Welfare Trust has given regular support to over 12,000 orphaned children in the past year. The assistance has safeguarded these children from hunger, nakedness and degradation.

Larger programmes have taken place in the Middle East, where attritional wars have decimated communities of their menfolk. Alhamdulillah, the support has reduced the burdens on mothers here who, after Allah, have had little recourse for the welfare of their children.

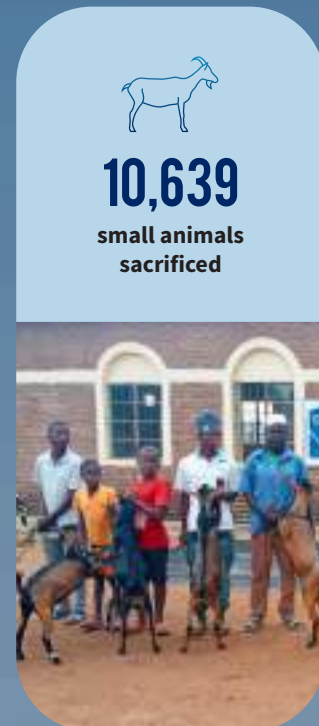

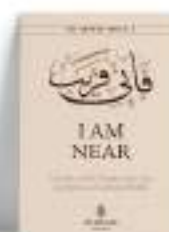

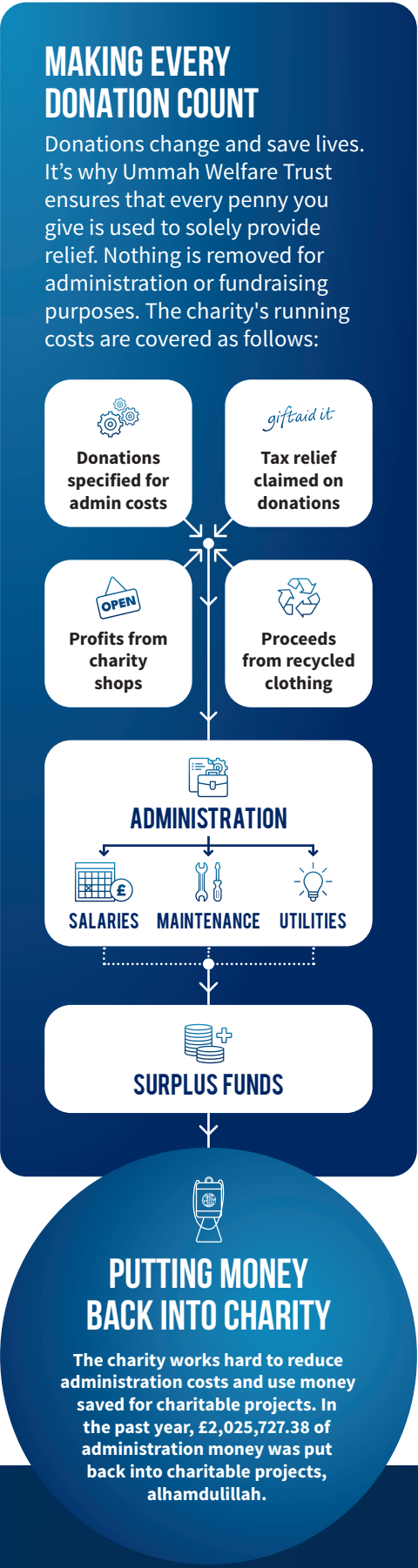
