YOUR OURBANI IN ASIA


The joys of Eid were brought to hundreds of thousands of Muslims across Asia this year. The largest programme took place in India's West Bengal region where 3,000 animals were sacrificed. Thousands of poor and marginalized Muslims here were given Udhiyyah to enjoy, alhamdulillah.

The next most extensive programme was in sanction-hit Afghanistan, where over 2,800 animals were sacrificed. The meat was distributed to poor families in the capital, Kabul, and in the country's eastern regions.

Across the border, in Pakistan, over 600 cows and goats were sacrificed to feed thousands of poor Muslims in KPK, Layyah and Karachi. Alhamdulillah, a further 400 animals were sacrificed for families in the mountainous Kashmiri district of Bagh.

Finally, thousands of miles east in Bangladesh, over 120 animals were sacrificed, and their meat distributed to poor families in Chittagong. While across the Indian ocean in Sri Lanka, hundreds of families also enjoyed your offerings, alhamdulillah.








THE MIDDLE EAST

Ummah Welfare Trust's largest programme in the Middle East came in Yemen. Around 1,600 goats were sacrificed here, feeding tens of thousands of families across the capital Sana'a and in the southern province of Ta'iz.

Further north in Bilad ash-Shaam, 200 rams were sacrificed in Syria's Idlib province, while 40 animals were sacrificed in Iraq's Anbar province. The meat of these animals brought smiles to over a thousand families enduring poverty and displacement.







AFRICA & EUROPE

Over a thousand animals were sacrificed across the African continent this year. Qurbani programmes took place in Gambia, Malawi, Mauritania, Sierra Leone and Ethiopia, alhamdulillah.

The largest programme was in central Malawi, where over 550 goats and 110 cows were sacrificed, feeding thousands of families in turn. To the north, around 170 animals were sacrificed in Ethiopia and distributed to orphaned and displaced families to the south of the capital, Addis Ababa.

In the west of the continent, over 120 animals were sacrificed to feed poor Muslims in The Gambia and Mauritania. And a further 26 cows were sacrificed in Sierra Leone's inland areas.

Lastly, over 200 sheep were sacrificed in Albania, feeding hundreds of poor and orphaned families for the days of Eid.
