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Trials That Call Us Forward

The fires of war across Gaza haven't abated, despite half a million deaths and the deceitful claims of a ceasefire - in truth, a malicious ruse to continue the plunder and killing of steadfast Palestinians and the encroachment of the sanctified Al-Aqsa.

Almost two million homeless and traumatised Rohingya people, meanwhile, remain abandoned by, not just governments, but the whole Ummah. And a nation of Uyghur Muslims continue to have their history, religion and identity buried in the soil of their genocide.

Elsewhere in West Africa and other regions, after succumbing to generations of poverty and neglect, many Muslims continue to sell their religion to missionaries simply to obtain food and education.

Against this tide of fitan and plots, much of it still to be uncovered, Ummah Welfare Trust continues its goal to aid and elevate our suffering brothers and sisters. Through your generosity, the charity had spent over £60 million in the past year helping them overcome the hardships.

Though a small amount compared to what we are today witnessing, we ask Allah, Al-Basit, to expand, multiply and prolong this ongoing assistance, made possible by your support and supplications.

May Allah reward you, dear donor, alongside the charity's volunteers and staff. Your hands have remained extended, while their striving has remained continuous. May Allah ease the hardships of our brothers and sisters, and recompense everyone involved in this caravan of charity with the highest Jannah.

The Crying of a Child

Islam is a religion of mercy and mutual compassion. Great importance is given to this concept; in fact, we have many reports from our master and leader, the Messenger of Allah, Sallallahu 'alayhi wasallam, demonstrating how he embodied mercy even during his most spiritual acts of worship.

One such incident is narrated below.

Imagine your imam—the Prophet —leading salah in the second holiest masjid, Masjid al-Nabawi. Behind him stands the greatest congregation ever to walk the face of this earth: the Sahabah RadhyAllahu 'anhum. What would that scene be like? Abu Qatadah al-Harith RadhyAllahu 'anhu narrates that the Prophet said:

'Indeed, I stand in prayer intending to prolong it, but when I hear the crying of a child in the mosque, I shorten my prayer out of fear that I may cause hardship for the child's mother.' (Bukhari)

SubhanAllah, see how compassionate the Prophet was, even towards the youngest and most vulnerable members of the Ummah. His profound mercy is evident in his concern for a mother and her young child, even during an important moment of prayer.

If this is how our beloved Prophet responded to the crying of a child for no extreme reason, how would he respond today to the endless cries and screams of pain from children across the world: in Gaza, among the Uyghurs, in Syria, in Yemen, and in many other places where Muslims continue to face oppression?



Helping *Gaza* Survive

For those with an ounce of iman, what has been inflicted upon Gaza cannot be forgotten. More than one hundred thousand souls have been killed, a figure that, in truth, is far higher; a quarter of a million have been wounded; over 5,000 have suffered amputations, many of them children; more than 5,000 have been rendered blind; and over 3,300 have been left severely burned.

Alongside the human suffering, more than 70% of all homes have been destroyed, over a thousand masjids levelled, forty hospitals shelled out of service and 400 schools wiped out. Over 80% of the economy has been shattered, while survivors now live in less than half of the remaining enclave.

Ummah Welfare Trust has spent over £20 million since the beginning of the genocide helping our brothers and sisters survive as each day brought new terrors. A small amount given the magnitude of the crimes, yet vital in preserving the lives of thousands of our brothers and sisters.

Cooked meals, clean water and fresh bread have been delivered daily to counter the enforced hunger. Vouchers, blankets and hygiene kits have enabled families to have supplies while enduring the crippling siege, an ongoing extension of the genocide.



Relief containers have also delivered life-saving supplies, such as food packs and blankets. And just as importantly, several Qur'an schools have been funded, ensuring that thousands of children can continue to learn the Book of Allah without interruption.

The criminal plan to forcibly remove Gaza's remaining families remains unchanged, and calls to desecrate Masjid Al-Aqsa continue to grow more intense. May neither come to pass in our lifetimes.

Sustenance for *Syria*

Although total war in Syria has ended, uncertainty and poverty remain. Families continue to struggle amid destroyed homes and devastated infrastructure, while more than 1.5 million people remain displaced in makeshift camps with almost nothing left in their old towns to return to.

Yet, signs of hope are emerging. The green shoots of freedom persist, and Syria's economic and spiritual recovery is slowly gaining strength. To support the blessed land's revival, Ummah Welfare Trust has invested over £10 million in the past year, in a wide range of relief programmes, alhamdulillah.

Much of Afghanistan's endemic poverty today remains externally imposed. Four decades of invasions, followed by crippling sanctions and the recent forced return of millions of Afghans from Iran and Pakistan, have stretched the country's already meagre resources to breaking point.

Helping Afghanistan's post-war recovery would be a boon for the entire Ummah. Ummah Welfare Trust has spent over £19 million in the past year supporting this effort, delivering food programmes, voucher assistance and winter supplies to thousands of the country's poor and remote families.

Emergency aid isn't enough to uplift a nation of stout, hardworking Muslims. That's why Ummah Welfare Trust has also delivered rickshaws to breadwinners, bored wells in parched areas and provided funds to the fragile health sector, all aiming to create lasting, transformative change.

We ask Allah to continue the newfound peace in Afghanistan, for its poverty and isolation today are testaments to the unimaginable suffering it endured for over forty years. May Allah raise a generation from among them imbued with iman and the material strength to benefit the Ummah.

Overcoming *Natural* *Disasters*



Over the past year, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, and Afghanistan were struck by devastating natural disasters. Devastating flash floods tore through Pakistan and Sri Lanka, while a powerful earthquake struck Afghanistan's poor eastern provinces. The tragedies claimed thousands of lives and left countless more displaced and destitute.

With your support, Ummah Welfare Trust established soup kitchens and clinics in Pakistan and Afghanistan's impacted communities, and delivered household supplies to remote villages. While in Sri Lanka, grants reached stricken families to help them fully recover.

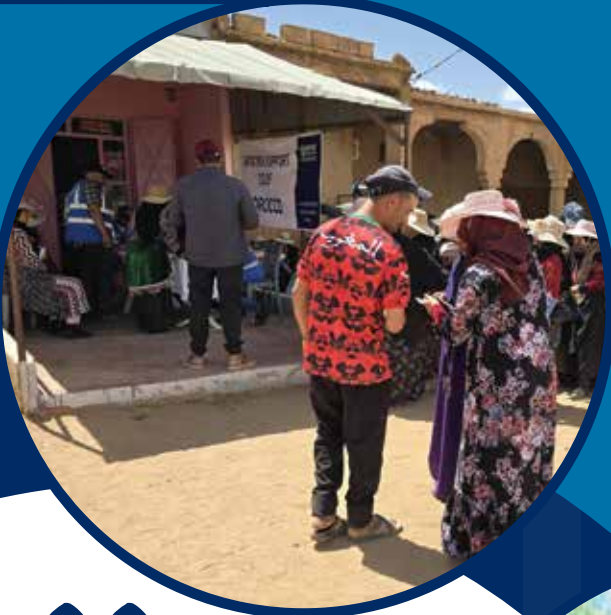

Assisting the *Rohingya* & Bangladesh

The prolonged genocide and displacement of the Rohingya Muslims remain among the most overlooked calamities of the Ummah, despite being one of the most horrific. A community that has upheld Islam since the ninth century remains scattered, denied their rights and abandoned by the Ummah.

Today, around two million impoverished survivors live in camps in southern Bangladesh, enclosed by barbed wire, where they are unable to move freely, access formal education, or obtain legal employment. Ummah Welfare Trust has continued to deliver emergency aid to this forgotten nation.

Large-scale food programmes have allowed new arrivals to settle and begin rebuilding their shattered lives in unfamiliar lands. Inside Myanmar's Arakan State, where the Rohingya live in even greater isolation, the charity has provided supplies to hundreds of stranded families.

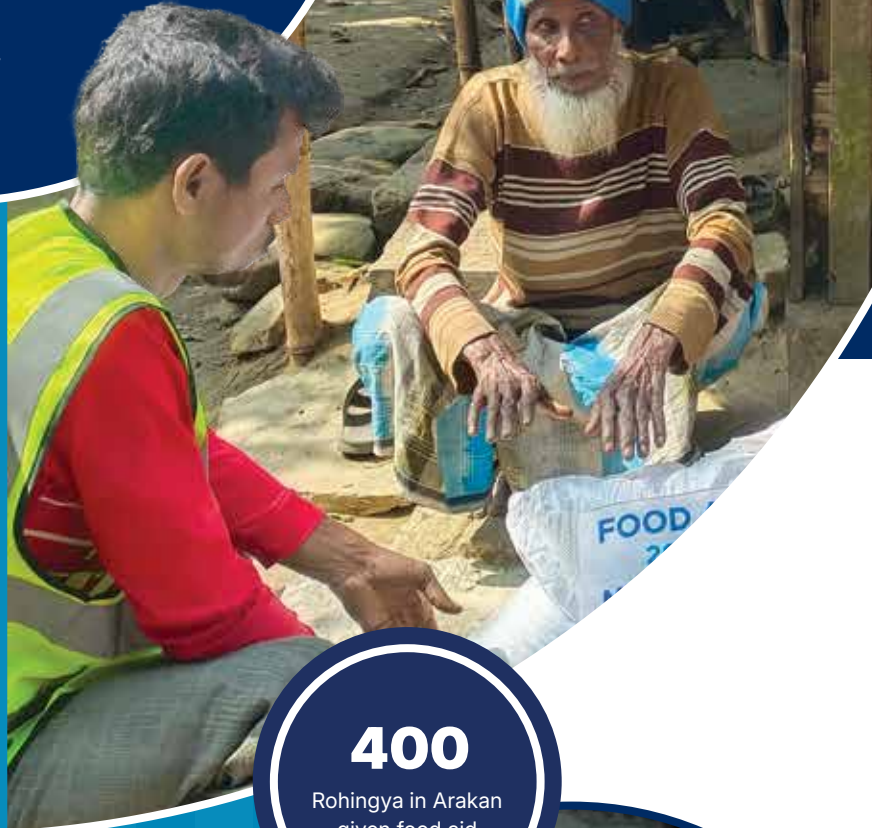

In a curriculum prepared and curated by ulama, the Quranic Tarbiyah programme inculcates a Muslim and Qur'an-centred identity in young students, helping them interpret, navigate and overcome today's challenges with religious confidence and no loss of faith.

Thanks to you, the syllabus and support provided are comprehensive. Students receive high-quality academic books for each year of the five-year course, regular new uniforms and stationery; all while undergoing regular examinations to monitor their progress.

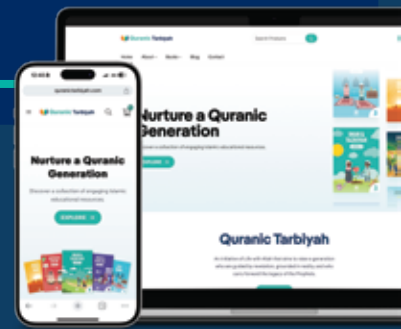

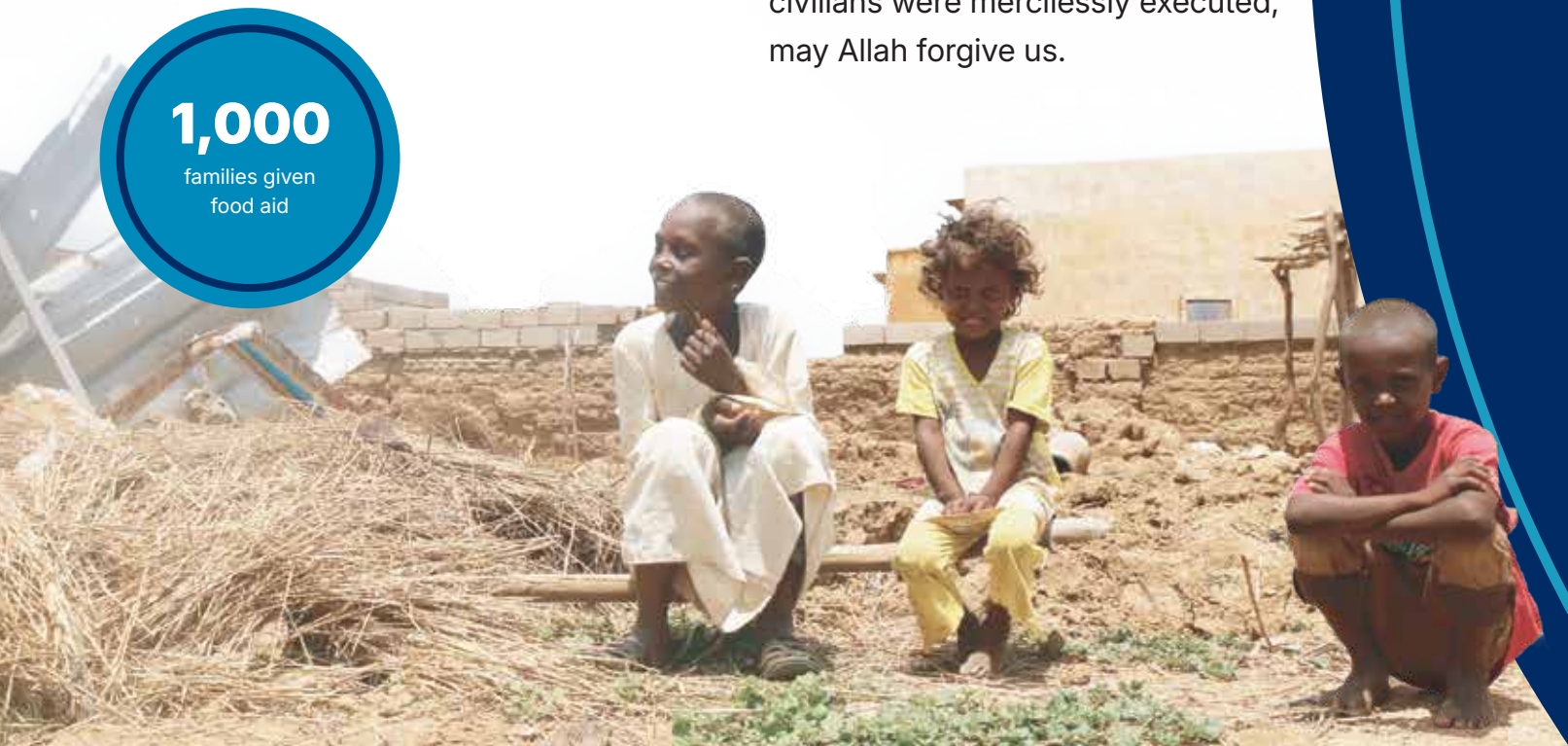
A Lifeline for *Sudan*

In 2018, the Sudanese revolution against long-standing authoritarian rule plunged the country into a period of profound instability. This was followed by a military coup in 2019, backed and armed by foreign powers, which rapidly deepened political divisions and led to a devastating civil war impacting every province..

Since then, more than 150,000 civilians are estimated to have lost their lives. Over 14 million people have been displaced, while vast areas of the country been plunged into acute hunger and poverty. One of the darkest chapters of this conflict unfolded in the town of El Fasher, where tens of thousands of civilians were mercilessly executed, may Allah forgive us.

Ummah Welfare Trust, having previously worked with refugees in Sudan for many years, has delivered vital food staples to thousands of displaced families on the outskirts of the capital, Khartoum, during the past year. The supplies have been lifesaving for many who've fled with nothing but the clothes on their backs.

Relief efforts will continue to expand for the countless displaced and dispossessed in a region that has endured years—indeed, decades—of untold suffering. May Allah keep us close to this land's pious inhabitants and replace their pain with victory and justice.

Fighting the *Uyghur* Erasure

In a generation scarred by wounds on the Ummah, the attempted erasure of the Uyghur nation stands among the most painful. For at least a decade now, the Chinese government has detained millions of Uyghur Muslims in concentration camps it calls 'vocational education and training centres'.

Inside these centres, Uyghurs endure communist indoctrination, torture and coerced medical procedures. Women and children are not spared. In 2024 alone, 86,000 Uyghur children were forcibly taken from their families and sent to remote provinces for enforced 'cultural assimilation'.

Tragically, an indifferent Ummah, distracted by Chinese ascendancy, has largely turned a blind eye to the suffering of our brothers and sisters. While many argue that options are limited, such excuses will carry little weight before Allah on the Day of Judgement.

In a small but ongoing effort, Ummah Welfare Trust is supporting the rehabilitation and education of thousands of Uyghur refugees in Turkey. A nation's Muslim heritage is priceless and safeguarding it is essential to nurture any hope of future victory. May Allah preserve it for our Uyghur brothers and sisters.

Livelihoods & Health

The Path to Lasting Independence

Traditional aid, such as food and vouchers, may meet the immediate needs of poor communities, but does little to remove the underlying poverty that holds them back. The provision of skills and livelihoods is therefore vital for helping families secure long-term resilience.

Ummah Welfare Trust continues to expand its livelihood programmes towards this goal. Close to a million pounds has been spent providing rickshaws, kiosks, livestock, and more to poor families seeking to leverage their skills and time to overcome deprivation.

Though results take time, livelihoods provide economic freedom, which is ultimately both the means and the end of all charity work; as Islam intended. We ask Allah to expand such efforts across the Ummah, at both state and individual levels, so that the believers may become financially strong.

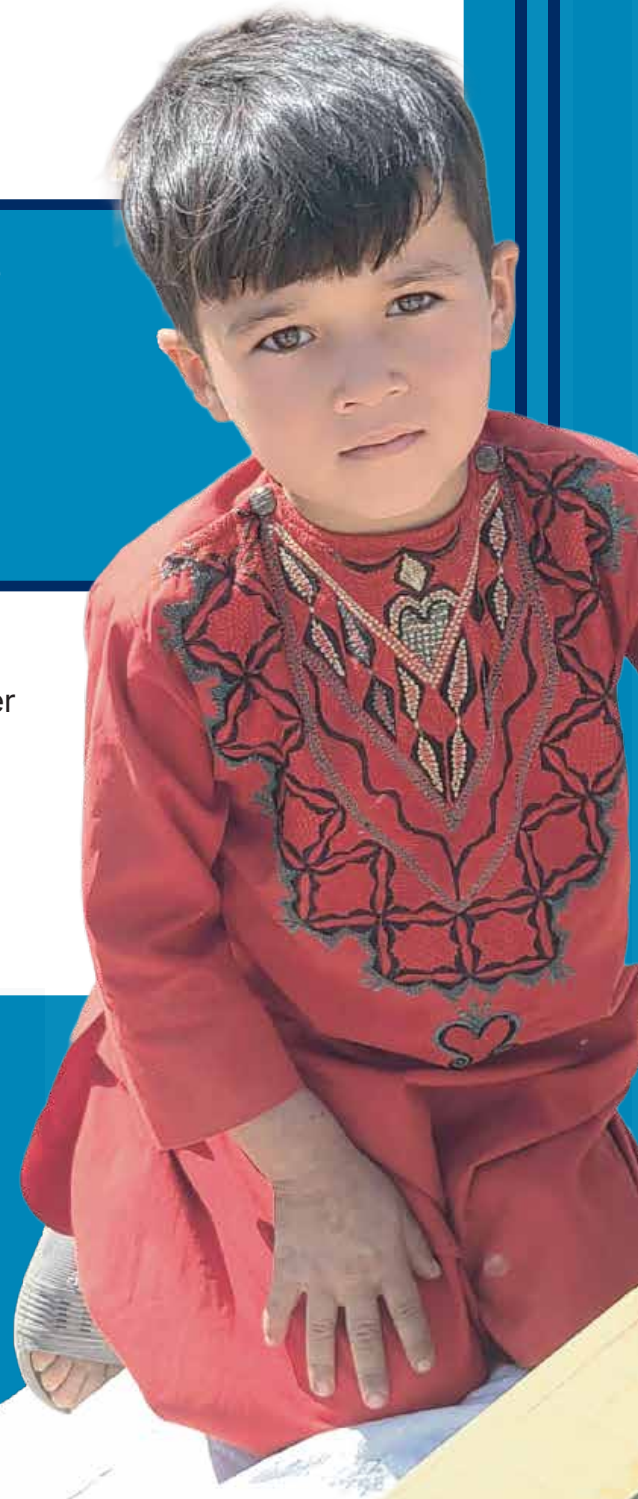

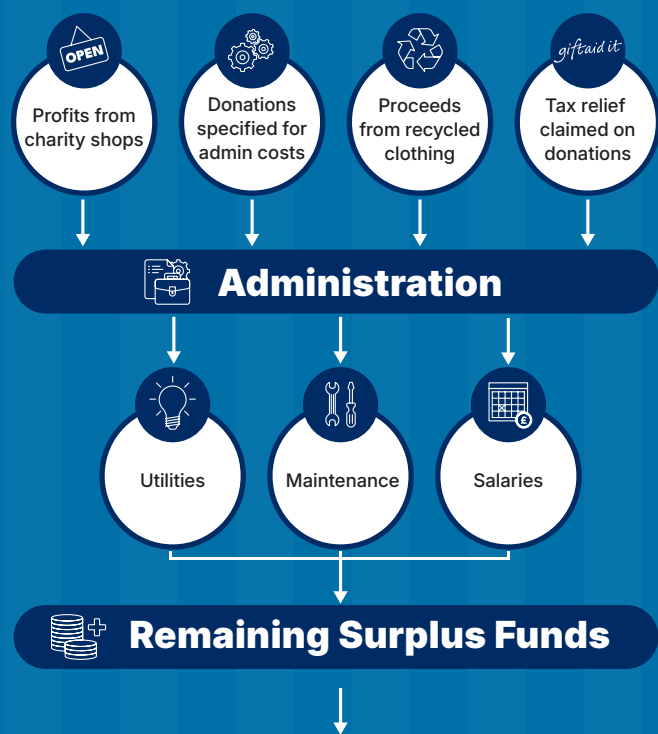

DELIVERING EVERY DONATION

Ummah Welfare Trust ensures that every penny you give is used to deliver and provide relief. Nothing is removed for administration or fundraising purposes. The charity's running costs are covered as follows:



MONEY BACK INTO CHARITY

The charity strives to reduce administration costs and use any money saved for charitable projects. In the last year, £2.73 million of administration money was put back into charitable projects, alhamdulillah.
